How to Write Your Math Homework

To Begin:

- 1. Write the assignment in your homework log with the date assigned and date due.
- 2. Get a blank piece of paper.
- 3. If your paper has holes, make sure the holes are on the left.
- 4. If your paper has lines and margins, make sure the big margin is at the top.
- 5. Put your name and date at the very top of the paper.
- 6. Put the title of your work on the top line as the heading. Include the page number and section number as well as the section name.

While doing your work:

- 1. If you circle the problem numbers, circle all of them.
- 2. Number each problem only before you do it. Don't number them all at the beginning.
- 3. Do no more than 8 problems per page.
- 4. Leave at least ¼ inch of space between the problems. Use a spacer to help you.
- 5. Write each problem before doing it. If there are too many words, summarize it in your own words.
- 6. Use the space to organize your thinking as you do the problem.

When you finish each problem:

- 1. Check to make sure you answered the question asked.
- 2. Make sure your answer can be found easily and quickly. If you circle the problem numbers, don't circle the answers.
- 3. Leave at least ¼ inch of space before starting the next problem.
- 4. Number the next problem in the same way you did the previous one.

When you finish the problem set:

- 1. Collect all the pages in order and staple them.
- 2. Make sure your name is on the first page and the rest of the pages have at least your initials.
- 3. Put the assignment in a safe place until you can get it turned it.
- 4. Log the assignment as finished and leave a space to record the grade.
